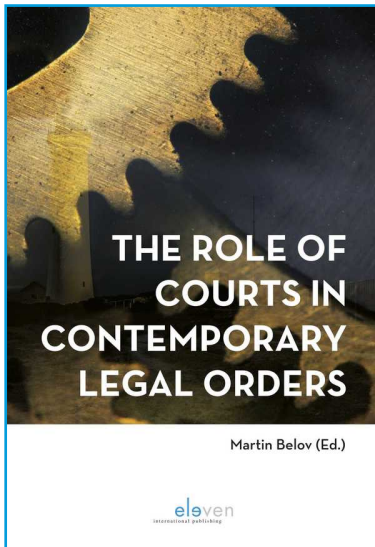


The Role of Courts in Contemporary Legal Orders

Key issues related to the impact of courts on environmental and human rights' protection are also addressed. The book finishes with the provocative chapter on the alternatives to courts.
